Fixing a Glaze that has Frozen, Thickened, or Dead-Panned

- · You will need the offending jar of glaze
- · 2 empty containers
- A stick blender or elbow grease
- Darvan #7
- 60 mesh Sieve or a Tea Strainer or doubled up
- Teaspoon for measuring
- Spoon to empty your jar
- Rubber rib

If the glaze has settled out, remove some of the water and set aside. This will help prevent the glaze from dead-panning again. This goes very quickly. Empty the contents of the glaze container into another mixing container.





Transfer the problem glaze into another mixing container.

Add 2-5 drops of Darvan. Mix with a stick blender. Darvan aids in the mixing and begins to thin the glaze.

Add 1-2 Tablespoons of water if you would like it thinner.

Sieve your glaze to create a smooth consistency!

It should now be ready to brush. If you find that it doesn't flow well, you can add 1-2 Tablespoons of Amaco Gum Solution or Georgie's Glaze Fix.

2. Darvan #7



3. Add 2-5 drops Darvan to the glaze in the new container



4. Begin to mix



5. Mix thoroughly



6. Sieve to remove any lumps



7. Ready to brush



8. It should now brush easily *

^{*}Add 1-2 Tablespoons of Amaco Gum Solution or Georgie's Glaze Fix if the glaze dries too quickly for the brush.
