

Fixing a Glaze that has Frozen, Thickened or Dead-Panned

- You will need the offending jar of glaze
- 2 empty containers
- A stick blender or elbow grease
- Darvan #7
- 60 mesh Sieve or a Tea Strainer or doubled up Nylon Stocking
- Teaspoon for measuring
- Spoon to empty your jar
- Rubber rib



Transfer the glaze you want to adjust into another mixing container.

This goes very quickly. Empty the contents of the glaze container into another mixing container.

Add 1-2 teaspoons of Darvan.

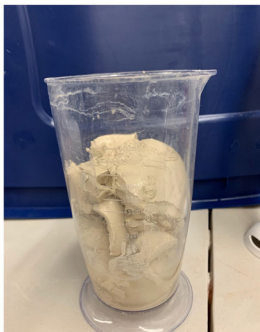
Mix with a stick blender. Darvan aids in the mixing and begins to thin the glaze.

Add 1-2 Tablespoons of water if you would like it thinner.

Sieve your glaze!

It should now be ready to brush.

If you find that it doesn't flow well, you can add 1-2 Tablespoons of Amaco Gum Solution



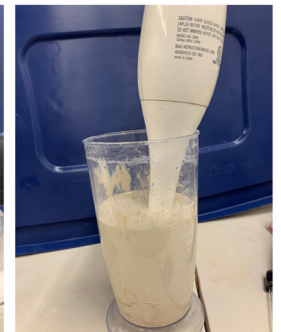
1. Contents in an empty container.



2. Darvan #7



3. Add 1-2 teaspoons Darvan to the glaze in the new container



4. Begin to mix



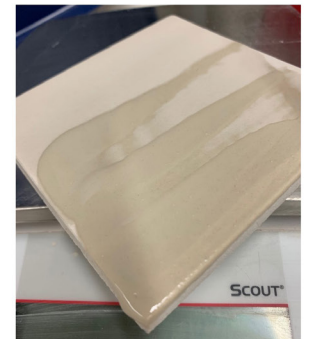
5. Mix thoroughly



6. Sieve to remove any lumps



7. Ready to brush



8. It should now brush easily

Add 1-2 Tablespoons of Amaco Gum Solution if the glaze dries too quickly for the brush.
